Dropped Objects can and do occur anywhere and anytime, but statistics show that we are more exposed to Dropped Objects during winter months.

Before undertaking any task, consider the prevailing weather. High winds, hail, sleet, snow or poor visibility can all increase the risk of potential dropped objects.

Ensure ice and snow is removed from the top of containers, skid bases, forklift pockets and loads prior to back loading.

Regularly clear any buildup of ice or packed snow from structures, walkways etc. Regular jarring of the derrick can also help shake loose ice in a controlled manner.

Warm your hands before manual lifting or

using tools – statistics show that far more objects and tools are dropped in winter due to cold hands.
